“Small but terrible” this is the library in Ratong, small library with big heart for children, small library with lots of beautiful books you can read, small library with big smiles of children.

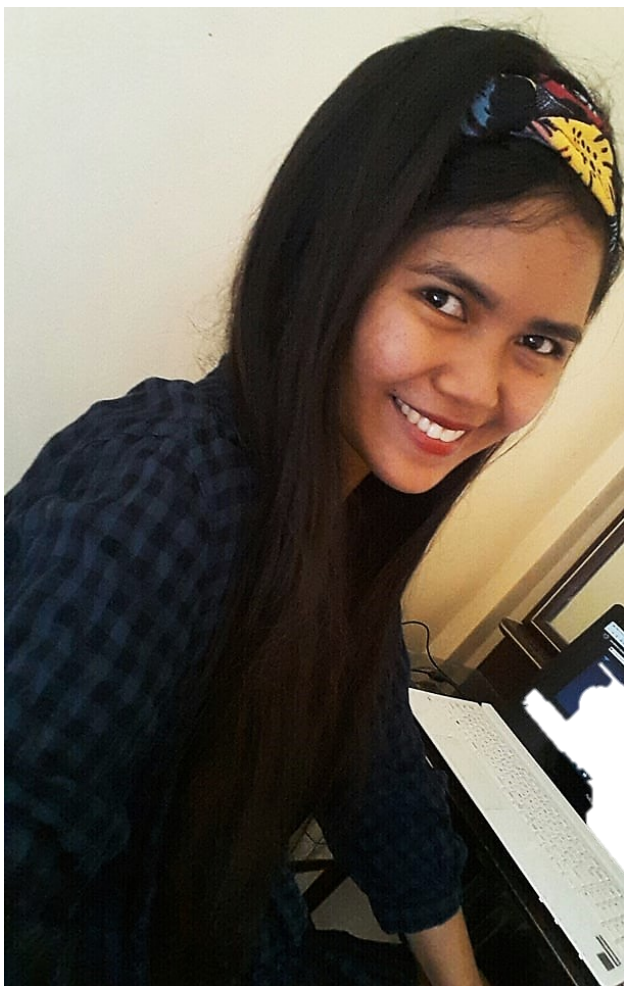
